Jaimey Hamilton Faris is Associate Professor of Art History and Critical Theory at the University of Hawai'i Mānoa. "Closeness, comfort, and recognition—these are fundamental to our relationships with each other and the world. Art gives us many opportunities to explore these intimate spaces of connection. In honor of Valentine's Day—and using a dynamic slideshow featured contemporary painters, sculptors, and more—this presentation explored artists who revel in the wonders of belonging—and the mysteries of the spaces in between."


Included in the slide presentation were Amish Kapono, Amy Stallman, Lucien Freud, Marina Abramovic's amazing performance piece, "The Gaze" as well as three local artists Lynn Yamamoto, Mary Babcock and Kaili Chung who explore the similar topic of connection and spaces through their very different medium choices.

Speaker: Margaret Bendet Topic: Taking a Step Back



We all have our stories, and telling these stories is part of what makes us human. It's a way we share and discover and learn; beyond this, it's enormously satisfying.

Margaret Bendet, formerly the features editor of the *Honolulu Star Bulletin*, will lead some simple exercises as an introduction to writing memoir. At the heart of memoir is the statement *I remember...* With this straightforward beginning, you can explore any part of your life you wish. And why wouldn't you? Most of us spend hours of our day focused on other people's stories, looking at other people's lives, entertained by other people's imaginings. There is so much for us to learn when we take a step back and look at ourselves, delve into our own wealth of experience.

Margaret Bendet now lives on Whidbey Island in Washington State, where she teaches classes in memoir writing and works as an independent editor and writing coach. She recently published the book *Learning to Eat Along the Way: A Memoir*, which begins when she was living in Honolulu and a member of the working press. Following an interview with an Indian holy man—in the book, she calls him "the swami"—Margaret makes a precipitous move. She leaves home and job to follow the swami in pursuit of enlightenment—unconditional and unending joy—and winds up facing demons that were inside her all along. Margaret's story about how she overcame intense infatuation, anorexia, and buli-



mia has been called "honest, raw, warm, funny, and real." She hopes that it will inspire you to tell your own story. margaretbendet.com/book
